# LIQUIDATING TRUSTEE'S MOTION FOR APPROVAL OF SETTLEMENT WITH AGILE PERFORMANCE FUND, L.P. AND PAYMENT OF CONTINGENCY FEE

Any interested party who fails to file and serve a written response to this motion within 21 days after the date of service stated in this motion shall, pursuant to Local Rule 9013-1(D), be deemed to have consented to the entry of an order in the form attached to this motion. Any scheduled hearing may then be cancelled.

Barry E. Mukamal, in his capacity as liquidating trustee ("Liquidating Trustee") for the Palm

Beach Finance Partners Liquidating Trust ("Liquidating Trust"), by and through undersigned counsel,

and pursuant to Fed. R. Bankr. P. 9019, seeks an Order from this Court approving a settlement of claims

asserted against Agile Performance Fund, L.P. ("APF"). In support of this relief, the Liquidating

Trustee states the following:

# I. Factual Background

# A. The Pre-Petition Activities of PBF I

1. The Liquidating Trust is the successor to Palm Beach Finance Partners, L.P. ("*PBF I*").

2. PBF I was formed to lend monies in purchase financing transactions supposedly brokered

by Thomas Petters and his company, Petters Company, Inc. ("PCI") in the consumer goods business.

The idea was that PBF I and other lenders would supply bridge financing to PCI and then later, once

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goods were received by a particular big box retailer, the retailer would remit the payment to the lender or PCI.

3. In reality, PBF I's investments in PCI were worthless - PCI's purchase and financing transactions were fictitious and part of an elaborate, multi-billion dollar *Ponzi* scheme perpetrated by Mr. Petters, Deanna Munson a/k/a Deanna Coleman, Robert White and others. No retailer ever made any payment on the purchase and sale of goods because the deals never existed.

4. On September 24, 2008, federal agents raided Mr. Petters' offices. Thereafter, Mr. Petters' companies were placed into federal receivership. Ultimately, Mr. Petters was convicted of his crimes and sentenced to 50 years in prison. Other persons complicit in the fraud were sentenced to prison sentences as well.

5. On November 30, 2009 ("*Petition Date*"), PBF I commenced a Chapter 11 bankruptcy case by filing a voluntary petition for relief under Chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of Florida ("*Bankruptcy Court*").

6. On October 21, 2010, the Bankruptcy Court entered its Order Confirming Second Amended Plan of Liquidation [ECF No. 444], creating the Liquidating Trust and appointing the Liquidating Trustee as liquidating trustee.

### **B.** Transfers Made to APF

7. APF was a limited partner in PBF I.

8. Based on a cash in, cash out analysis, APF received a profit in the amount of \$322,837.09 with respect to its limited partner investment in PBF I ("*Profit Distribution*").

9. On November 18, 2011, the Liquidating Trustee, on behalf of the Liquidating Trust, commenced an adversary proceeding against APF seeking to avoid the Profit Distribution APF received from PBF I, Adv. Case No. 11-2858-PGH ("*Litigation*").

# **II. Settlement Terms**

10. The key aspects of the stipulation of settlement between the parties ("Stipulation") are the following:<sup>1</sup>

- APF will pay (or cause to be paid) \$43,000.00 to the Liquidating Trustee a) ("Settlement Payment"); and
- b) APF shall not be entitled to any distribution from the PBF I bankruptcy estate, and any proof of claim or interest that APF may have scheduled or filed in the PBF I bankruptcy case will be disallowed in its entirety and stricken.

# **III. Relief Requested**

11. The Liquidating Trustee seeks an Order from this Court (a) approving the Stipulation and (b) approving the Contingency Fee (as defined below).

12. Federal Rule of Bankruptcy Procedure 9019 provides in relevant part that [o]n motion . . . and after a hearing on notice to creditors; the debtor . . . and to such other entities as the Court may designate, the Court may approve a compromise or settlement."

13. Approval of a settlement in a bankruptcy proceeding is within the sole discretion of the Court and will not be disturbed or modified on appeal unless approval or disapproval is an abuse of discretion. In re Arrow Air, 85 BR 891 (Bankr. S.D. Fla. 1988).

14. The standards for approval are well settled and require the Court to inquire into the reasonableness of the proposed settlement. See, e.g., Protective Comm. for Indep. Stockholders of TMT Trailer Ferry, Inc. v. Anderson, 390 U.S. 414, 424 (1968); In re W.T. Grant Co., 699 F.2d 599, 608 (2d Cir. 1983); Florida Trailer and Equip. Co. v. Deal, 284 F.2d 567, 571 (5th Cir. 1960). The inquiry need only determine whether the settlement falls below the lowest point of the range of reasonableness. See W.T. Grant Co., 699 F.2d at 608; see also In re Martin, 91 F.3d 389 (3rd Cir. 1996); In re Louise's Inc.,

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211 B.R. 798 (D. Del. 1997) (setting forth considerations by the Court for approval of a settlement, including: (i) the probability of success in litigation, (ii) the likely difficulties in collection; (iii) the complexity of the litigation involved, and the expense, inconvenience and delay necessarily attending it; and (iv) the paramount interest of the creditors.

### A. The Stipulation Ought to be Approved

15. Based upon the above legal principles, the Liquidating Trustee asserts that the Stipulation falls well above the lowest point of the range of reasonableness and thus, should be approved.

### Probability of success in litigation

16. The Liquidating Trustee, on behalf of the Liquidating Trust, could assert that the Profit Distribution to APF was a constructively fraudulent transfer under federal or state law, or alternatively, that APF were unjustly enriched by the Profit Distribution.

17. The Liquidating Trustee believes that he will likely succeed in prosecuting either of these causes of action. Nonetheless, the Liquidating Trustee acknowledges that there are risks inherent in all litigation and there is the possibility that APF, or other similarly situated parties, could raise certain issues or defenses that potentially could impact the Liquidating Trustee's claims.

### *Collectability*

18. Collectability is a significant issue that substantiates approval of the Stipulation.

19. APF has provided the Liquidating Trustee documents demonstrating it has *de minimis* assets and that it is a defunct entity.

### Complexity of litigation and attendant expense, inconvenience and delay

20. This is a meaningful consideration that militates in favor of approval of the Stipulation.

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21. In sum, although many of the claims outlined above are typical claims litigated before this Court, they still potentially require retention of experts and extensive fact discovery before a trial could take place.

22. Moreover, assuming the Liquidating Trustee was successful in obtaining a judgment against APF, he would then have to engage in collection efforts, which would be futile against APF given that it is essentially a defunct entity with no assets.

23. The Stipulation addresses these concerns. The parties avoid litigating fact specific claims, with the attendant expense and delay of litigation being nullified.

### Paramount interest of creditors

24. Settlement is warranted as APF is a defunct entity with no assets. Additionally, APF has agreed to waive any potential or corresponding claim.

25. This result gives certainty to the estate and avoids the risk, expense and delay attendant with litigation. As such, the Stipulation is in the paramount interest of PBF I's creditors and should be approved.

### B. The Contingency Fee Ought to be Approved

26. Pursuant to the Plan and this Court's Order Approving the Trustee's Motion to Approve Hybrid Form of Compensation [ECF No. 223], Meland Russin & Budwick, P.A. ("*MRB*") is entitled to a contingency fee of 10% for any affirmative recovery it obtains on behalf of the Liquidating Trusts without further order of the Court ("*Contingency Fee*").

27. As such, MRB requests that the Contingency Fee be paid from the Settlement Payment without further Order from this Court.

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WHEREFORE, the Liquidating Trustee requests that this Court enter an Order (similar in form to the Order attached as <u>Exhibit 2</u>) (1) approving the Stipulation; (2) approving payment of the Contingency Fee; and (3) granting such other relief this Court deems just and proper.

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#### STIPULATION OF SETTLEMENT

This Stipulation of Settlement (the "Stipulation") is entered into on November 14, 2013 by and between (a) Barry E. Mukamal, in his capacity as liquidating trustee (the "Liquidating Trustee") of the Palm Beach Finance Partners Liquidating Trust (the "Liquidating Trust") and (b) Agile Performance Fund, LP ("APF") (the Liquidating Trustee and APF are at times individually referred to as a "Party" or collectively, the "Parties"). The terms of this Stipulation are as follows:

#### RECITALS

A. On November 30, 2009 (the "*Petition Date*"). Palm Beach Finance Partners, L.P. ("*PBF T*") commenced a Chapter 11 bankruptcy case by filing a voluntary petition for relief under Chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of Florida (the "*Bankruptcy Court*"):

B. On October 21, 2010, the Bankruptey Court entered its Order Confirming Second Amended Plan of Liquidation [ECF No. 444], creating the Liquidating Trust and appointing the Liquidating Trustee as liquidating trustee:

C. The Liquidating Trustee, on behalf of the Liquidating Trust, filed an adversary proceeding against APF, Adv. Case No. 11-2858-PGH, that seeks to recover certain transfers made by PBF1 to or for the benefit of APF (the "Litigation"):

D. APF expressly denies the claims that are asserted in the Litigation;

F. The Parties have engaged in discussions in an attempt to resolve any and all issues, including the claims which are, or could be, raised in the Litigation; and

F. To avoid the continued expense and risk of adverse outcome arising from the Litigation, as well as incurring costs and expenses associated therewith, among other reasons, the Parties have agreed to resolve the Litigation pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Stipulation.

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NOW, WHEREFORE, it is stipulated, consented to and agreed, by and among the Parties as follows:

 No admission of liability. The Parties acknowledge that this Stipulation is a compromise and settlement of a controversy. No Party admits, and each expressly denies, any liability on its part.

2. Entire agreement. This Stipulation constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and there are no other stipulations, agreements, representations, or warranties other than those specifically set forth herein. All prior agreements and understandings between the Parties concerning the subject matter hereof are superseded by the terms of this Stipulation.

3. Settlement Payment. In full and final settlement of the Litigation, APF shall pay (or cause to be paid) the aggregate sum of \$43,000 (the "Settlement Payment"). The Settlement Payment shall be made via (i) wire transfer pursuant to written instructions to be provided by the Liquidating Trustee or his counsel or (ii) check made payable to "Barry E. Mukamal, Liquidating Trustee" and delivered to Jonathan S. Feldman, Esq., Meland Russin & Budwick, P.A. 200 South Biscayne Blvd., Suite 3200, Miami, Florida 33131.

4. No entitlement to distribution. APF agrees that it shall not be entitled to any monetary distribution whatsoever from the Liquidating Trust or PBF 1. To the extent APF has scheduled or filed any proof of claim or proof of interest in the PBF 1 bankruptcy case, such cham or interest shall be deemed disallowed in its entirety and be strucken.

### 5. General releases between the Parties.

A. For purposes of this Stipulation, the term "*Claims*" shall mean any obligations, causes of action, demands of any type that a party may presently have, may have or have had in the past, upon or by reason of any matter, cause or thing whatsoever, including

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without limitation any and all obligations, causes of actions and demands of any kind whatsoever, at law or in equity, indirect, derivative, or direct, known or unknown, discovered or undiscovered.

B. Upon approval of this Stipulation by final order of the Bankruptcy Court and payment of the Settlement Payment, the Liquidating Trustee, on behalf of the Liquidating. Trust and PBF I, waives, releases and holds fiarmless, now and forever, APF thea attorneys, agents, and representatives, and each of the successors and assigns of such persons acting in such capacity, from any and all Claims that the Liquidating Trustee, the Liquidating Trust or PBF I may have against APF; provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to release, waive or otherwise limit any rights or obligations arising out of this Stipulation. The scope of this release shall not impact, impair or alter in any manner any Claims whatsoever that the Liquidating Trustee, on behalt of the Liquidating Trust or PBF I, may have against any parties other than APF their attorneys, agents, and representatives, and each of the successors and assigns of such persons acting in such capacity, including but not fimited to Claims against any alleged concurrent or consecutive tortfeasors, if any.

C. Upon approval of this Stipulation by final order of the Bankruptey Court and payment of the entire Settlement Payment. APF waives, release and hold barmless, now and forever, the Liquidating Trustee, the Liquidating Trust and PBF 1 from any and all Claims that APF may have against the Liquidating Trustee, the Liquidating Trust or PBF 1: provided that this provision does not release, waive or otherwise limit any rights or obligations arising out of this Stipulation.

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5. Authorization to bind. The individuals signing below represent and warrant that they have the authority to execute this Stipulation on behalf of the applicable Party and bind then: to its terms.

6. **Review/No Duress.** Each of the Parties acknowledges that he, she or it has read all of the terms of this Stipulation, has had an opportunity to consult with counsel of his, her or its own choosing or voluntarily waived such right, and enters into those terms voluntarily and without duress.

7. Attorneys' fees and costs. Each Party shall bear its own attorneys' fees and costs in connection with the negotiation of this Stipulation and monous and orders as may be accessary to obtain the approval of this Stipulation by the Baukruptev Court: <u>provided</u> that that in the event of any hrigation between the Parties under this Stipulation or arising as a result of a default under this Stipulation, the prevailing Party shall be entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees and costs related thereto, including, but not limited to, those incursed at all trial and appellate tevels.

8 No waiver of modification. This Stipulation and any of the specific items, covenants, and conditions contained herein, may not be waived, changed, altered or modified except by an instrument in writing signed by the Party against whom enforcement of such change is sought.

9. Effective date. This Stipulation shall be effective upon execution by all of the Parties hereto, subject only to approval of this Stipulation by final order of the Bankruptey Court and payment of the Settlement Payment. Upon it becoming effective, this Stipulation shall be bunding on all of the Parties' successors or assigns.

10. **No effect.** If the Bankruptcy Court does not approve this Sripulation, then the Stipulation shall be of no further force or effect, and the Parties shall be restored to their rights as

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they existed prior to the execution of this Stipulation. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the Bankruptcy Court does not approve this Stipulation because any of the Parties have tailed to provide the Bankruptcy Court with adequate information to rule on the merits of the Stipulation, the Parties will use their best efforts to seek reconsideration of any order declining to approve the Stipulation, or to file an amended motion to approve the Stipulation.

11. **Controlling law.** This Stipulation shall in all respects be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida applicable to contracts made and to be performed wholly within the State of Florida and by federal law to the extent the same has preempted the laws of the State of Florida.

12. **Counterparts.** This Stipulation may be executed in any number of counterparts and by different parties hereto in separate counterparts, each of which when so executed shall be deemed to be an original and all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same Stipulation. Delivery of an executed counterpart of a signature page to this Stipulation by facsimile shall be effective as delivery of a manually executed counterpart of this Stipulation.

13. **Construction**. This Stipulation shall be deemed to have been jointly drafted by the Parties, and in construing and interpreting this Stipulation, no provision shall be construed and interpreted for or against any of the Parties because such provision or any other provision of the Stipulation as a whole is purportedly prepared or requested by such Party.

14 Jurisdiction. The Bankruptey Court shall retain exclusive jurisdiction to enforce the terms of this Stipulation.

- 4. The Court retains jurisdiction to enforce the terms of the Stipulation.
- 5. MRB's Contingency Fee in the amount of \$4,300.00 is approved and the

Liquidating Trustee is authorized to pay this amount upon funding of the Settlement Payment.
